CCSD Opening Timeline

- March 1 - All Pre-Kindergarten through Grade 3 students can return to face-to-face instruction under the hybrid instructional model.
- March 15 - Central office staff returns to working onsite to best support our schools.
- March 22 - Grades 6, 9, & 12 can return to face-to-face instruction under the hybrid instructional model (school based staff returns on March 15 to prepare to receive students).
- April 6 - Grades 7, 8, 10 & 11 can return to face-to-face instruction under the hybrid instructional model (school based licensed staff returns on March 22 to prepare to receive students).
- April 6 - Pre-Kindergarten through grade 5 can return to five days a week face-to-face instruction.

We will continue to offer a full-time distance education option to our families who feel more comfortable keeping their children at home.

- The Henderson City Council must approved all spending from the education set aside fund and the distribution from the City's Recreational Marijuana Set Aside Funding is scheduled to be reviewed and discussed at the October 20th regular City Council meeting (NB-34 on the agenda). Upon approval by the City Council, for schools within the Clark County School

District, funding will be disbursed to the Clark County School District Grants Office for internal processing and distribution according to the terms of our current interlocal agreement.

Application has been approved for the full \$15,000 distribution.

3.1 The City of Henderson just released our “Resident Recovery Grants”. Residents financially impacted by COVID-19 can complete one application to receive a grant for utilities assistance, childcare costs, and the cost of internet services for education. Applicants must be residents of the City of Henderson and funds are paid directly to the resident and it is taxable so they will be required to complete a W-9.

The program allows for payment of rent, mortgage, and utility arrears back to March 1, 2020, as well as utility deposits, security deposits and emergency lodging.
